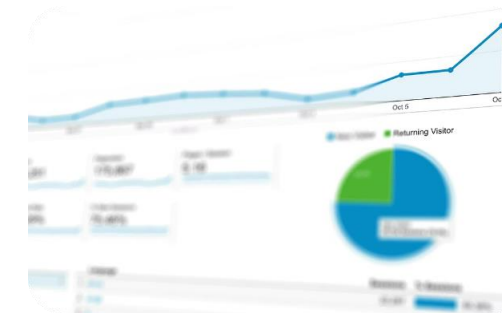
## Connected Decisions

Connected systems ensure that high performance is repeatable, not accidental.

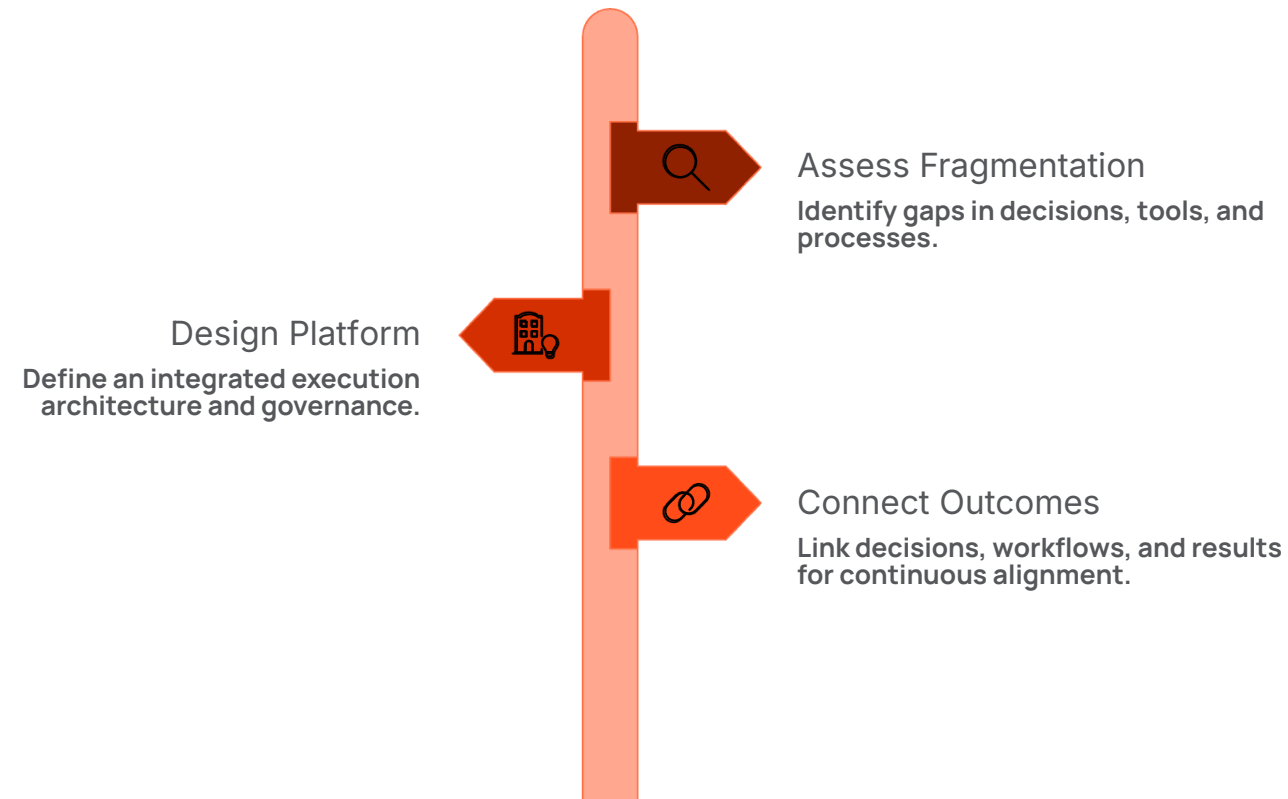
## Compounding Advantage
