Why It Matters Now

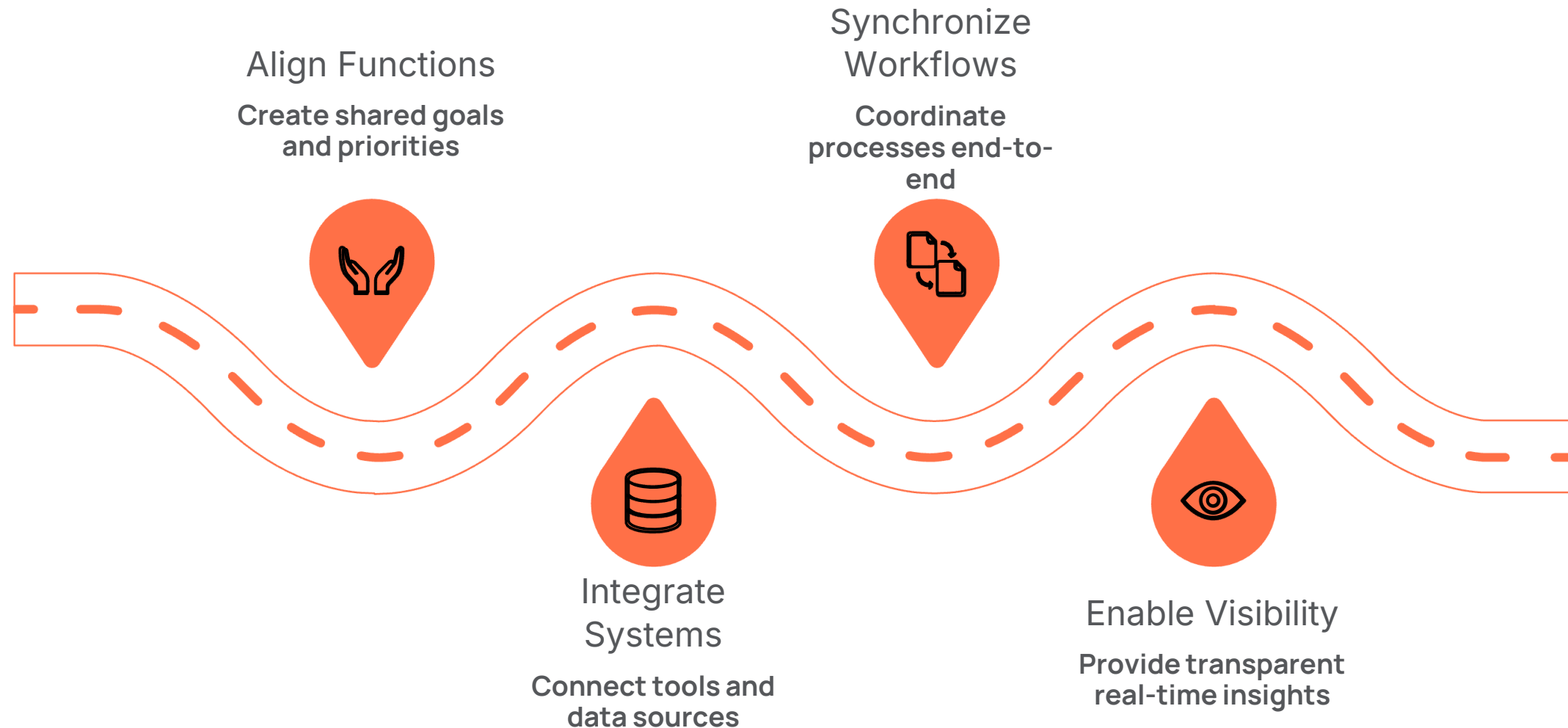
