

Reverse Logistics & The Circular Margin

Traditional supply chains have been designed as linear systems—produce, sell, and dispose. However, rising material costs, supply volatility, and sustainability pressures are forcing a fundamental shift toward circular value chains. Leading manufacturers are now redefining “end-of-life” as the beginning of a new value cycle, leveraging reverse logistics to reclaim, refurbish, and reintegrate products and materials.

A global manufacturer recognized that reverse logistics was not just an operational necessity—but a strategic opportunity to unlock a “second margin” from existing products while reducing dependency on volatile raw materials. The Strategic Challenge

The organization managed forward flows efficiently—but exercised no control over value after the point of sale. Without structured product return flows, the company was leaving significant residual value on the table while simultaneously absorbing the full cost of raw material price volatility. The absence of reverse logistics visibility meant that recovered components, recyclable materials, and refurbishable assets were either discarded or handled through inefficient, manual processes.

The Core Problem

A linear supply chain model with no structured product return flows meant the organization had no mechanism to capture value after the sale. Every disposed product represented a lost opportunity—both financially and operationally.

Five Critical Gaps

- No structured return flows — linear model with no reverse channel design
- High material cost exposure — volatile raw material and feedstock prices
- Zero reverse visibility — no tracking of returned products or recovery potential
- Manual, inefficient processes — reverse logistics handled ad hoc
- Missed residual value — no mechanism to capture end-of-life product worth

The organization managed forward flows—but did not control value after sale. Every product that left the building was a value stream that simply disappeared.

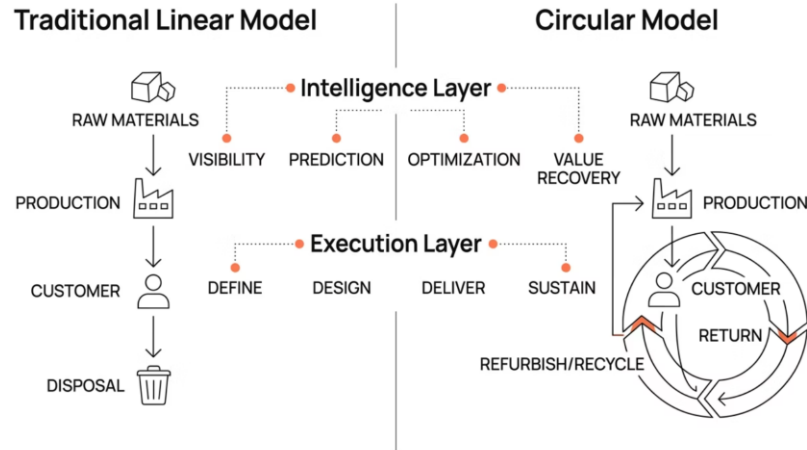
SUSTAIN — Embed Circular Value
